

He's commercially repped by Stewart Talent and has appeared in ads for Venmo, Monday.com, and IHG Hotels.




Baily (she/her) is a full time teacher and director who focuses on telling new stories with an emphasis on those about women.

We are a volunteer based group whose main goal is to have fun in a creative environment in which we can grow in storytelling together.


